When should I get my passport?

Sooner is always better than later with passports! To be safe at least 6-8 weeks before your date of departure.

How long does it take to get a passport?

To be safe, 6-8 weeks.

Can I expedite my passport processing time?

Yes you can. Depending on how you do it, it can shorten the processing time to 3 weeks, or even up to 8 business days. Remember that a steep fee will be applicable, so rather try to avoid this by applying early.

When is it time to renew my passport?

Your passport should be valid for 6 months after your date of return. It is important not to assume that your passport is still valid, but to actually find it and double check.

This is usually the process, but your circumstances might be different (see the link below for more detail): Get passport form D-11 from your local post office, fill it out and get all the required documentation ready. Get a passport photo taken (available at Walmart or certain pharmacies). Take your completed form, documentation and passport photo in person back to the post office.

Who pays for my passport, and how much will it cost?

You are responsible for your own passport cost, as well as for any other related costs like for instance passport photos, photocopies and so forth. The entire process is usually \$150 to \$180, depending on your situation.
